

# All Callers

## A. Questions

1. Where is the medical emergency?
2. What number are you calling from?
3. What is the problem there?
4. Is the patient conscious?
5. Is the patient breathing normally?
6. How old is the patient?
7. What is the gender of the patient?

## C. EMD Notes

Advise the caller to stay on the phone with you while you send help or ask a series of questions.  
 If there is any uncertainty of whether the patient is breathing or not, consider Cardiac/Respiratory Arrest Card immediately.
